The QuickBooks fixed asset module is recommended to separately track all assets purchased under a government contract, as all as indirect assets to automate the depreciation calculations for book and tax purposes. A contractor may have some contracts that are primarily service oriented, while others may be more material intensive. In such a situation, the contracts that are material intensive may incur a much greater dollar amount in costs, but require less administrative effort.

The chart of accounts is notable for government contractors because of the need to identify and segregate unallowable costs. Unless the software maintains discrete accounts and supporting processes, it is likely that the unallowable costs will find their way into an invoice.

Government Contractor Chart Of Accounts

The chart of accounts is a listing of general ledger accounts organized by account type. In a typical chart of accounts, you will find a balance sheet section with assets and liabilities, an equity section, and an expense section. The chart of accounts utilized in government contracting has some similarities to the typical chart of accounts utilized by commercial enterprises, and the balance sheet and equity sections are nearly the same, but the similarity ends there.
