If you are eligible for Medicaid except for having excess income and you can show that you have medical bills equal to your excess income in a particular month, Medicaid will pay your additional medical bills beyond that for the rest of that month.

To qualify for Medicaid, federal law states that you must be a United States citizen or legal immigrant with at least five years of residency. New York's Medicaid program also requires you to be a current resident of New York.
