The term "glass escalator" was introduced by Christine L. Williams in her article "The Glass Escalator: Hidden Advantages for Men in the "Female" Professions" published in August 1992. The glass escalator refers to the way men, namely heterosexual white men, are put on a fast track to advanced positions when entering primarily female-dominated professions.

It was thought that this glass escalator offered a "free ride" to all men, but a new qualitative case study of 17 black male nurses by Adia Harvey Wingfield (2009) suggests otherwise. Wingfield found that black male nurses were more likely to experience the "glass ceiling" than the "glass escalator."

CRL Blumcraft Glass Smoke Baffles and Smoke Curtains (also known as Draft Curtains or Smoke Screen), are used for limiting the spread of smoke and providing adequate egress during evacuations. Sometimes mistaken for smoke barriers, Glass Smoke Baffles and Smoke Curtains limit the spread of smoke in an area to activate a sprinkler in the building.
