The prevailing regimes for the carriage of goods by sea are “one-way mandatory,” which means that contracts must not derogate from the convention to the shipper’s detriment, but derogation that increases the carrier’s obligations is allowed.

The Carriage of Goods by Sea Act (COGSA) Under US COGSA, the limitation of liability on the carrier or the ship does not exceed USD500 per package or unit or the equivalent of that sum in other currency, unless the nature and value of such goods have been inserted in the bill of lading.
